



Consultation about establishing a Resource Base for children with autism at Bordesley Village Primary School

Deadline for responses: 12pm on Wednesday 22nd July 2026

Cromwell Learning Community Multi Academy Trust, in partnership with Birmingham City Council, is proposing to establish a Resource Base for children with autism at Bordesley Village Primary School, Emmeline St, Birmingham B9 4NG. The provision would support up to 12 children in Reception-Year 6 with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) which specifies Resource Base provision.

What is being proposed?

This consultation is about whether to establish a Resource Base for children with autism at Bordesley Village Primary School. This would support up to 12 children, between Reception to Year 6 Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) which specifies Resource Base provision to support their learning needs.

The Resource Base would provide a calm, autism-informed learning space, which would be fully integrated into the already strong school at Bordesley Village Primary School. This would enable these children to benefit from the strength of the school's ethos, culture, curriculum and approach.

What is a Resource Base?

A Resource Base provides specialist support to a small cohort of students to enable them to make strong progress within a mainstream school.

The Resource Base would be an integral part of the school and would increase the expertise available to support all pupils.



Why is this being proposed?

Bordesley Village Primary School, Cromwell Learning Community Multi Academy Trust and Birmingham City Council are committed to ensuring that young people can thrive in local schools. Establishing a Resource Base at Bordesley Village Primary School helps meet local need and reflects the commitment to inclusive mainstream education.

What facilities would the Resource Base have?

The Resource Base would be located in the school building and would include specialist classrooms, sensory spaces and small-group spaces.

Current classrooms

After changing to a 1 form-entry school, there are a growing number of un-used classrooms available.

How would the Resource Base be funded?

The Resource Base would receive additional funding from Birmingham City Council on top of standard school funding.

Who are we consulting?

We are consulting staff, parents and carers, pupils, associated professionals, other schools and interested parties.
